NM Department of Game & Fish

In a January 8, 2007 letter, the Department wrote, "The Department has been made aware of a problem concerning the start dates for rifle and muzzle loader hunting opportunity in Game Management Units (GMU) 34 and 36. The discrepancy in the start dates between the public hunts and private land ranch-only was an oversight and will be corrected in the spring of this year at either the March or April State Game Commission meeting.

The corrected start dates for private land ranch-only ranches in GMU 34 and 36 will be as follows:

<u>Muzzle Loader</u>: Public land & private land ranch-only start date, 10/06/2007

Any legal weapon: Public land & private land ranch-only start date, 10/13/2007

Farmers' Almanac February Gardening Tips

1 Fine for planting beans, tomatoes, corn, cotton, cucumbers, peppers, melons and other aboveground crops where climate allows. Plant seedbeds and flower gardens.

2-6 Clear ground, turn sod. Kill plant pests.

7-9 Favorable days for planting root crops. Fine for sowing grains, hay and forage crops. Plant flowers.

10-11 Plant carrots, turnips, onions, beets, Irish potatoes and other root crops in the South.
Lettuce, cabbage, collards and other leafy vegetables will do well. Start seedbeds.

12-13 Neither plant nor sow on these barren days.
14-15 Any root crops that can be planted now will

16-17 Barren days. Fine for clearing, plowing, fertilizing and killing plant pests.

18-19 Plant peppers, sweet corn, tomatoes and other aboveground crops in southern Florida, California and Texas. Extra good for cucumbers, peas, cantaloupes and other vine crops. Set strawberry plants.

20-21 Seeds planted now will grow poorly and yield little

22-24 Fine for planting beans, peppers, cucumbers, melons and other aboveground crops where climate is suitable.

25-26 Any seed planted now will tend to rot. 27-28 Fine for planting beans, tomatoes, corn, cotton, cucumbers, peppers, melons and other aboveground crops where climate allows. Plant seedbeds and flower gardens.
